Holistic rubric

A successful reflection will:

- Identify--within the first one or two sentences--[insert number] thoughts or actions you want to begin, change, or adhere to
- Provide appropriate evidence for all thoughts or actions highlighted in the main idea
- Extensively integrate relevant ideas from the pillar (morals, ethics, action, or faith) into the discussion of thoughts or actions you want to begin, change, or adhere to
- Articulate thoughtful and extensive application of thoughts or actions you want to begin, change, or adhere to personal life and/or to the community

Note 1: For both rubrics above, users should consider how many new pieces of information [I.e., trends, themes, highlights] they will require of students.

Note 2: The analytic rubric currently is worth a possible 20 points [5 points x 4 criteria]. Instructors should feel free to adjust point values to be commensurate with their overall assessment plan.
